The Johnstown Road Dental Clinic, which is located in FCBDD's Early Childhood Education and Family Center at 2879 Johnstown Road, has received a highly prestigious honor. The DentaQuest Institute has chosen the clinic to receive its "Center of Excellence" award.

The award recognizes "dental programs that have displayed tremendous leadership and excellence in oral health management and have greatly improved the oral health status of their patients."

The award will be presented at the National Primary Oral Health Conference in Denver on November 12th. Pediatric dentist Diego Solis, D.D.S., will accept the award on behalf of the team of dentists and dental assistants at the clinic.

The Johnstown Road Dental Clinic provides comprehensive dental services for preschool and school-age children. The clinic is part of the Nisonger Center Dental Program.

## Cathy Bregar receives leadership award



Cathy Bregar, Director of Special Education for Reynoldsburg Schools, has received the 2013 Kathe Shelby Leadership Award. The state award is given annually to an outstanding special education leader.

On September 19th, a group of artists from ARC West spent several hours touring Glass Axis, a glass blowing facility in Grandview.

Glass Axis provides classes for those interested in learning glass blowing techniques.

After touring the facility, the artists took turns working with a glass blower to make a glass ornament. They selected the colors and held the glass in the hot fire until it turned red. The artists then blew into a tube, filling the glass with air, much like a bubble, while the Axis staff shaped the molten glass and instructed the artist on when to blow and when to stop.

## ADD phasing out employment program

The Association for the Developmentally Disabled (ADD) has decided to discontinue its Employment Services program.

In a letter to FCBDD Service Coordinators, ADD Chief Executive Anthony Hartley said that the change will ensure that ADD will "remain a viable organization that will continue to serve individuals with disabilities in ADD's other programs."

Individuals served by ADD's Employment Services program will be offered day programs, including opportunities for social interaction, volunteer work, education, creative arts, theater and recreation and leisure.

The initial stage of the phaseout, affecting 148 employees, began October 31st. The second stage will affect 86 employees and is scheduled for June, 2014.

# 11th annual Star Awards night was special

The reporter and co-anchor expressed thanks for being invited to return to hosting duties. "I enjoy this so much... you do wonderful work that makes our community proud."

He went on to introduce the award recipients while slides showing their images played. As the recipients' names were announced, they came forward to an appreciative audience's enthusiastic applause (not to mention shouts, whistles, foot-stomping and sign-waving).

Her late husband, Roger Gove, M.D., once served as head of Ohio's service system and later as a FCBDD board member.

FCBDD Chairman Dean Fadel closed the festivities. He congratulated the award winners, praised the efforts of self-advocates and thanked "all the folks who pulled this evening together, especially Linda Fleming."



## The green spot by Chuck Lamb

In the interest of growing even greener, ARC East expanded its garden areas to include two large outdoor vegetable gardens as well as several patio herb gardens. Small table and container gardens were also constructed to enable consumers in wheelchairs to work independently.

Consumers planted, tended to, harvested, washed and sold their produce. Seeds were dried and kept for next year's planting. Cuttings and peels were used as compost.

Consumers learned the importance of healthy eating as well as how fresh produce tastes. One consumer remarked that it was the best salad he'd ever eaten. They also sharpened their skills by selling produce from carts at the workshop.

Over \$300 was raised this season, which will go back into the garden next year for seed, tools, dirt, mulch, etc. Some of the harvest was donated to Gahanna Residents In Need (G.R.I.N.), helping to support the local food pantry.

ARC East continues to Reuse, Repurpose and Recycle and encourages all to do the same.
