Waiting list implementation begins

After over one year of study and state rule development, the new Waiting List rule begins implementation in September, 2018.

The previous waiting list was not a true reflection of needs or who is waiting for services. Sometimes young children were placed on the list knowing that they did not want services until they were adults.

As required by the new rule, assessments to determine if a person has "immediate" or "current" needs will begin in September. "Immediate" need means a person needs services within 30 days to prevent harm and "current" need is defined as a need for service within the next 12 months. If the assessment determines that a person does not have an immediate or current need, that person will not be placed on the waiting list and will have the option to be re-assessed if his or her needs change at a later date.

It is important to note that "immediate" or "current" needs may be met by alternative resources that do not require a waiver. The new Waiting List is a list of people whose current need can only be met by a waiver and not alternative resources.

Assessments to determine needs of those on the previous waiting list will begin in September, 2018 and will continue over two years until December, 2020. Adult transportation update

It has been a busy summer for adult services, including the final steps in a major conversion of adult transportation services.

Rather than large school buses, the people attending ARC East, ARC North, ARC West, and Bixby and Northeast Centers are now riding in Vans or other alternative transportation vehicles. This conversion means shorter routes for most people, smaller vehicles and greater community access.

Discussions regarding this conversion to vans began last Fall. Initially, plans were to establish a separate non-profit organization to provide transportation services. Under this plan, ARC Industries will provide both adult day services and transportation to adult facilities.

Effective in January, 2019, all adult services staff members will become staff members of ARC Industries. These changes are due to a federal rule of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) that requires all County Boards of Developmental Disabilities to have "conflict free case management."

Transportation for the Early Childhood and School services will continue to be operated by the Franklin County Board of Developmental Disabilities in school buses.
