
Columbus Counts! 2020 Census begins

Beginning in March 2020, households will receive an invitation to respond online to the 2020 Census. This happens every 10 years.

Make sure you are counted to help shape the future of Columbus and Franklin County. Completing the Census helps keep important resources in our county, including support for Medicaid, schools, services for children and more. The more people are counted, the more federal funds will come to Ohio and we will have better representation in Congress.

It is particularly important to count all children and adults, including individuals with disabilities. Reminders will be sent to each household and if no response, census takers will visit the homes. All information reported is confidential.

Additional Census information will be provided at the Provider Fair at the Ohio State Fairgrounds on April 8 and at all Franklin County Board of Developmental Disabilities facilities. It just takes a few minutes to answer the 9 questions/each, for everyone in a household.



March is Awareness month


March has been designated Developmental Disabilities Awareness month to celebrate the contributions that individuals with developmental disabilities make to our communities.

The month will begin with a celebration at the Statehouse on March 4, 2020. After presentations in the morning, participants will meet with legislators. Legislative advocacy to secure laws that support individuals with disabilities is enhanced when lawmakers hear personal success stories and areas of needed improvement.

The month will also include other efforts by individuals and organizations to increase awareness through posters, open houses and other events. Thanks to Carl Scott, Print Shop Coordinator for the Franklin County Board of Developmental Disabilities, all central Ohio libraries will have D.D. Awareness bookmarks to hand out to visitors.



March is the month for Operation Feed



Operation Feed provides fresh, healthy food for local families struggling with hunger and is coordinated by the Mid-Ohio Foodbank. One in six Ohioans is food insecure, meaning they do not know where their next meal is coming from.

One hundred percent of every dollar raised through Operation Feed is used to provide food for local families via food pantries, soup kitchens and emergency shelters.

FCBDD staff, individuals served and families have long opened their hearts to provide strong support of Operation Feed. We look forward to many fun events to support this great cause!

DRO names director

Disability Rights Ohio (DRO) has named Kerstin Sjoberg its new Executive Director, replacing Michael Kirkman who is retiring after almost 40 years of advocacy for people with disabilities.

As DRO's Assistant Executive Director, Kerstin Sjoberg has been actively engaged in the agency's administration and management, including financial planning, oversight and resource development. As its Director of Advocacy, she has expanded DRO's work in this realm by utilizing both class action lawsuits and public policy campaigns.



Kerstin Sjoberg has also served as an Adjunct Professor at the Moritz College of Law, The Ohio State University, and previously was an associate at Jones Day in Columbus.

Disability Rights Ohio is designated under federal law as the Protection and Advocacy System and Client Assistance Program for the state of Ohio. The mission of Disability Rights Ohio is to advocate for the human, civil and legal rights of people with disabilities in Ohio. DRO provides legal advocacy and rights protection to a wide range of people with disabilities in Ohio.

OSDA to learn about Census

The Central Ohio Self Determination Association (OSDA) will meet on March 11, 2020 to learn about the importance of being counted in the 2020 Census.

Beginning in March, households will receive mail asking them to go online to fill out census information for everyone in that household. If people are not able to complete the information online, they will be given paper forms to complete. Beginning in April, Census Takers will visit all households that have not responded.

The U.S. Census Bureau conducts a Census count every 10 years. Federal funds and representatives in Congress are all influenced by the Census, so it is very important that everyone is counted. Many people in Ohio have Medicaid waivers, which are partially funded by the federal government.

The OSDA meeting will be held at the Bixby Center, 4200 Bixby Road, Groveport, Ohio, beginning at 10:00 a.m.

Senior Care Act introduced

Representative Joyce Beatty, Representative Steve Stivers and Senator Rob Portman have introduced legislation that will allow for people age 65 and older to continue to work and maintain their Medicaid coverage.

H.R. 5429 was introduced in the United States House of Representatives and S. 3010 was introduced in the United States Senate in December 2019. The legislation is called the SENIOR CARE ACT (Supporting and Empowering the Nation to Improve Outcomes that Reaffirm Careers, Activities, and Recreation for the Elderly Act.)

Senator Portman said, "I believe every disabled American over age 65 should have the opportunity to work and maintain Medicaid coverage." If passed, the bills will allow individuals to continue to receive Medicaid for daily long-term care services that most employer-sponsored insurance plans do not cover.

The Senior Care Act would remove the current age limit of 65.

STABLE Accounts update

Editor's note: Ohio Treasurer Robert Sprague recently announced that STABLE Accounts in Ohio are leading the country with a 40% increase in the past year. STABLE Accounts allow individuals to save money without losing their Medicaid benefits. Signing up is easy by visiting www.stableaccount.com. Below are excerpts from a recent fact sheet from Treasurer Sprague.

STABLE accounts are the premier ABLE (Achieving a Better Life Experience) program in the country, and more than one in four ABLE accounts are STABLE accounts. Since taking office one year ago, our team has made it a priority to grow the program even further and create innovative partnerships that are establishing STABLE accounts as a mainstream financial tool.

The STABLE Account program saw unprecedented growth and success in 2019. Our national presence was cemented in February with the opening of the 10,000th active account. By year's end, we surpassed 14,000 active accounts, effectively growing overall participation by more than 40 percent. This great news continued into November when STABLE reached \$100 million in total participant contributions.

Through the STABLE Account program, we are improving and empowering lives, while also helping to alleviate the financial burdens felt by families across the Buckeye State and nationwide.

Preschool memory boxes opened




It was twenty years ago that Early Childhood Instructor Cathy Gordon had her preschool students prepare memory boxes to be opened in 2020.


