The Regular meeting of the Franklin County Board of Developmental Disabilities was called to order by Board President Dean Fadel.

#### **MINUTES**

Mr. Underwood moved to approve the minutes from the regular meeting held on November 21, 2024, second by Ms. Straughter. (Vote of Yes: Harshaw; Kelly; Straughter; Swartz; Underwood; Wilkins; Fadel) Motion carried unanimously.

# Agency Updates by Superintendent/CEO Dot Yeager

#### **Budget, Finance and Human Resources:**

Superintendent/CEO Dot Yeager provided an update on the agency finances. Director of Fiscal Services Jennifer Schueneman explained our results compared to the prior year for 2024. We were at 103% of revenue due to \$2 million of funds received from the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD) for DSP waiver match. In our revised budget, we requested and received an increase in budget to address the increase expenditures for waiver match. With this revision, we ended up at 95% of expenditures at \$258 million. An agenda item today is for the 2025 waiver match in the amount of \$119,800,000.

In our HR report we reviewed activity for November and December 2024 – sadly, we report that Yaw Osei passed away and is missed greatly by colleagues here. We discussed program year calendars, which are Early Childhood, West Central, and Administrative and other staff. Superintendent Yeager provided reasoning of the various calendars needed. Another item discussed related to Human Resources, is the move to \$19/hour rate of pay, which is still pending with one of the bargaining units. This helps to align with the movement at the state level to have a minimum of \$19/hour rate of pay for Direct Support Professionals.
