The mission of Franklin County Family and Children First Council (FCFC) is to increase the access, capacity, and effectiveness of services for the most vulnerable Franklin County youth and their families.

-Programs within the agency: Help Me Grow- Early Intervention - Early Intervention (EI) provides coordinated early intervention services to parents of eligible children under the age of three with developmental delays or disabilities.

-Multi-System Service Coordination/Wraparound Program: Provides a collaborative approach to help families with children who have complex behavioral/developmental needs across multiple child-serving systems. Multi-System Facilitators connect agencies, people, and services to work with families to develop a coordinated plan of care for their child and family. FCFC believes utilizing the team approach helps to organize services to better meet the specific and unique needs of the family. Multisystem Care Teams are available to any Franklin County family with a child or youth (age birth through 21 years old) needing help with coordinating services from two or more programs.
